




THE NATIONAL BOARD OF CERTIFICATION FOR MEDICAL INTERPRETERS

Active certifications are those CMI credentials that are not expired, either because the original expiration date has not yet been reached or because the interpreter chose to recertify (renew the credential rather than allowing it to expire). Total certified to date includes all CMI credentials that have been issued by the National Board in each of the six languages as of 12/31/14 (both active and expired).



Exam Statistics 2014



In 2014, the National Board delivered 2448 exams, including 1415 written exams (1022 pass, 393 fail) and 1033 oral exams (419 pass, 614 fail). Passing Rates: Written Exam 72%. Oral Exams: Spanish 43%, Vietnamese 4%, Korean 29%, Russian 50%, Mandarin 31%, Cantonese 55%.
