


Exam Statistics 2015





In 2015, the National Board delivered 1727 exams, including 847 written exams (638 pass, 209 fail) and 880 oral exams (326 pass, 554 fail). Passing Rates: Written Exam 75%. Oral Exams: Spanish 44%, Vietnamese 4%, Mandarin 10%, Cantonese 30%, Korean 22%, Russian 24%.

Medical Interpreters Certified 2015



Active certifications are those CMI credentials that are not expired, either because the original expiration date has not yet been reached or because the interpreter chose to recertify (renew the credential rather than allowing it to expire). Total certified to date includes all CMI credentials that have been issued by the National Board in each of the six languages as of 12/31/15 (both active and expired).
